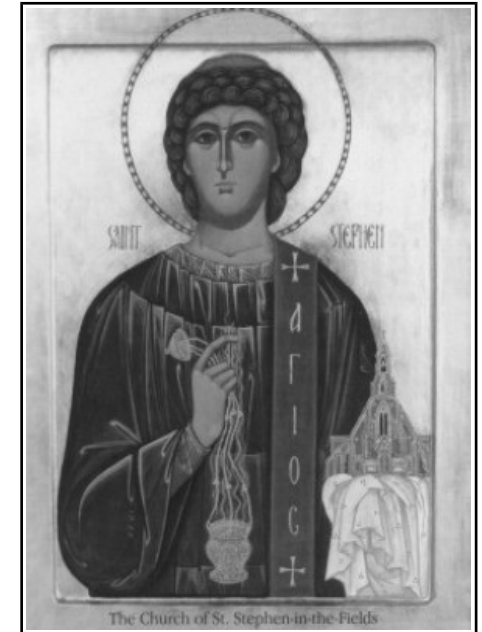

Psalm 65: *Te decet hymnus*

- 1 PRAISE IS due to thee, O God, in Si-on; /
**and unto thee shall the vow be performed
in Je-ru-sa[^]lem.**
- 2 **Thou that hearest the prayer, /
unto thee shall all flesh[^] come.**
- 3 My misdeeds prevail **a-gainst** me: /
O be thou merciful un-to our sins.
- 4 **Blessed is the man whom thou choolest and re-ceiv-est, /
that he may dwell in thy courts.**
- 5 We shall be satisfied with the pleasures of thy **house**, /
