Easter Vigil

April 19, 2014 at 9:00 pm

SERVICE OF LIGHT

When the congregation is assembled at the appointed place, the celebrant kindles the new fire and addresses the people with the following words.

Celebrant Dear friends in Christ, on this most holy night, when our Lord Jesus Christ passed from death to life, the Church invites her children throughout the world to come together in vigil and prayer. This is the Passover of the Lord. We remember his death and resurrection by hearing his word and celebrating his mysteries; we are confident that we shall share his victory over death and live with him for ever in God.

Let us pray.

Father, we share in the light of your glory through your Son, the light of the world. Sanctify this new fire, and inflame us with new hope. Purify our minds by this Easter celebration and bring us one day to the feast of eternal light. We ask this through Christ our Lord.

All **Amen.**

The celebrant marks a cross in the wax and traces the letters alpha and omega, and the numerals of the current year, saying

Christ yesterday and today, the beginning and the end, Alpha and Omega; all time belongs to him, and all the ages; to him be glory and power through every age for ever. **Amen.**

The celebrant marks five grains of incense inserted into the candle in the form of a cross, saying

By his holy and glorious wounds may Christ our Lord guard us and keep us. **Amen.**

The celebrant lights the candle from the fire, saying

May the light of Christ, rising in glory, dispel the darkness of our hearts and minds.

PROCESSION

The thurifer goes before the Deacon, who carries the Paschal candle, followed by the celebrant, and the congregation.

The procession halts, and, lifting the candle high, the Deacon sings this acclamation.

Deacon The light of Christ.

All **Thanks be to God.**

During the procession into the church, the Deacon twice lifts the candle high and sings the same acclamation on a higher pitch.

Also during the procession, all light their candles from the Paschal candle and take their places.

EASTER PROCLAMATION

The Paschal candle is placed in its stand.

As the Exultet is sung, all remain standing, as able, holding lighted candles.

Deacon Rejoice, heavenly powers! Sing, choirs of angels! Exult, all creation around God's throne! Jesus Christ, our King, is risen! Sound the trumpet of salvation!

Rejoice, O earth, in shining splendour, radiant in the brightness of your King! Christ has conquered! Glory fills you! Darkness vanishes for ever!

Rejoice, O Mother Church! Exult in glory! The risen Saviour shines upon you! Let this place resound with joy, echoing the mighty song of all God's people!

Deacon The Lord be with you.

All **And al- so with you.**

C. Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

***All* It is right to give our thanks and praise.**

Deacon It is truly right that with full hearts and minds and voices we should praise the unseen God, the all-powerful Father, and his only Son, our Lord Jesus Christ. For Christ has ransomed us with his blood, and paid for us the price of Adam's sin to our eternal Father!

This is our Passover feast, when Christ, the true Lamb, is slain, whose blood consecrates the homes of all believers.

This is the night when first you saved our forebears: you freed the people of Israel from their slavery and led them dry-shod through the sea. This is the night when Christians everywhere, washed clean of sin and freed from all defilement, are restored to grace and grow together in holiness.

This is the night when Jesus Christ broke the chains of death and rose triumphant from the grave.

Father, how wonderful your care for us! How boundless your merciful love! To ransom a slave you gave away your Son.

The power of this holy night dispels all evil, washes guilt away, restores lost innocence, brings mourners joy.

Night truly blessed when heaven is wedded to earth and we are reconciled with God!

Therefore, heavenly Father, in the joy of this night, receive our evening sacrifice of praise, your Church's solemn offering. Accept this Easter candle. May it always dispel the darkness of this night!

May the Morning Star which never sets find this flame still burning: Christ, that Morning Star, who came back from the dead, and shed his peaceful light on all creation, your Son who lives and reigns for ever and ever.

All **Amen.**

Please be seated. You may wish to extinguish your hand-candle.

LITURGY OF THE WORD

Celebrant Dear friends in Christ, let us now listen attentively to the word of God, recalling how he saved his people throughout history and in the fullness of time, sent his own Son to be our Redeemer.

First Reading: Genesis 1.1 – 2.4a

Reader The word of the Lord. *All* Thanks be to God.

Psalm 33

Cantor RE-JOICE in the Lord, you right-eous; /
All **it is good for the just to sing prais-es.**

**Praise the Lord with the[^]harp; /
play to him upon the psal-te-ry and[^]lyre.**

Cantor Sing for him a new song; /
sound a fanfare with all your skill up-on the trum-pet.

All **The word of the Lord is right; / and all his works are[^]sure.**

Cantor He loves righteousness and jus-tice; /
the loving-kindness of the Lord fills the whole earth.

All **By the word of the Lord were the hea-vens[^]made, /
by the breath of his mouth all the heaven-ly[^]hosts.**

Cantor He gathers up the waters of the ocean as in a wa-ter[^]skin; /
and stores up the depths of the sea.

All **Let all the earth fear the[^]Lord; /
let all who dwell in the world stand in awe of[^]him.**

Cantor For he spoke, and it came to[^]pass; / he commanded, and it stood fast.

All **The Lord brings the will of the nations to naught; /
he thwarts the designs of the peo-ples.**

Cantor But the Lord's will stands fast for ev-er, /
and the designs of his heart from age to[^]age.

All **Happy is the nation whose God is the[^]Lord! /
happy the people he has cho-sen[^]to be his[^]own!**

Cantor The Lord looks down from hea-ven, /
and beholds all the peo-ple in the[^]world.

All **From where he sits enthroned he turns his gaze /
on all who dwell on the earth.**

Cantor He fashions all the hearts of them / and un-der[^]stands all their[^]works.

All **There is no king that can be saved by a mighty ar-my; /
a strong man is not delivered by his great strength.**

Cantor The horse is a vain hope for de-liv-er[^]ance; /
for all its strength it cannot[^]save.

All **Behold, the eye of the Lord is upon those who fear him, /
on those who wait up-on his[^]love,**

Cantor To pluck their lives from death, / and to feed them in time of fam-ine.

All **Our soul waits for the[^]Lord; / he is our help and our shield.**

Cantor Indeed, our heart rejoices in him, / for in his holy name we put our[^]trust.

All **Let your loving-kindness, O Lord, be up-on us, /
as we have put our trust in[^]you.**

Please stand, as able.

Celebrant Almighty and eternal God, you created all things in wonderful beauty and order. Help us now to perceive how still more wonderful is the new creation, by which in the fullness of time you redeemed your people through the sacrifice of our Passover, Jesus Christ, who lives and reigns for ever and ever.

All **Amen.**

Please be seated.

Second Reading: Exodus 14.10-31, 15.20-21

This reading moves directly into the

Canticle: Exodus 15.1-3, 6, 11, 13, 17-18

Cantor I WILL sing to the Lord for his glorious tri-umph; /
the horse and the rider he has hurled in-to the[^]sea.

All **The Lord has become my strength and re-fuge; /
the Lord himself has be-come my sa-viour.
He is my God and I will praise him; /
my father's God and I will ex-alt him.**

All **The Lord himself is a mighty war-rior; /
the Lord, the Lord is his name.**
Cantor Your right hand, O Lord, is majestic in pow-er; /
Your right hand, O Lord, shat-ters^the en-e^my.
All **Who is like you, O Lord among the gods, /
holy, awesome, work-er^of won-ders?**
Cantor In steadfast love you led your peo-ple, /
you guided your redeemed with your great strength.
All **You brought them in safety to your holy place, /
and planted them firm on your own moun-tain.**
Cantor You brought them into your own house. /
All **The Lord shall reign for ev-er^and ev-er.**

Please stand, as able.

Celebrant God of steadfast love, your wonderful deeds of old shine forth even to our own day. By the power of your mighty arm you once delivered your chosen people from slavery under Pharaoh, to be a sign for us of the salvation of all nations by the water of baptism. Grant that all the peoples of the earth may be numbered among the offspring of Abraham, and rejoice in the inheritance of Israel. We ask this through Jesus Christ our Lord.

All **Amen.**

Third Reading: Baruch 3.9-15, 32 – 4.4

Reader The word of the Lord. *All* Thanks be to God.

Psalm 19

Cantor THE HEAV-ens declare the glo-ry of God, /

and one night imparts knowledge to an-oth-er.**
Cantor Although they have no words or lan-guage, /

Cantor By them also is your ser-vant^en-light-ened, /
and in keeping them there is great re-ward.

cleanse me from my sec-ret^faults.**
Cantor Above all, keep your servant from presumptuous sins;
let them not get do-min-ion^o-ver me; /
then shall I be whole and sound, and innocent of a great of^fense.
All **Let the words of my mouth and the meditation of my heart
be ac-cep-ta^ble^in your sight, /
O Lord, my strength and my re-deem-er.**

Celebrant Creator of the universe, Source of all light, teach us to hold fast to the ways of wisdom, that we may live for ever in the radiance of your glory. This we ask in the name of Jesus Christ our Saviour.

Fourth Reading: Ezekiel 36.24-28

Reader The word of the Lord. *All* Thanks be to God.

Psalm 42

Cantor AS THE deer longs for the[^]wa-ter-brooks, /
All **so longs my soul for you, O[^]God.**
My soul is athirst for God, athirst for the[^]liv-ing God; /
when shall I come to appear before the pre-sence of God?

Cantor My tears have been my food day and night, /
while all day long they say to me, “Where now is your[^]God?”

All **I pour out my soul when I think on these things: /**
how I went with the multitude and led them into the house of[^]God,

Cantor With the voice of praise and thanks-giv-ing, /

and why do I go so heavily while the enemy op-press-es[^]me?”

All **While my bones are be-ing bro-ken, /**
my enemies mock me to my[^]face;

Cantor All day long they mock me / and say to me, “Where now is your[^]God?”

All **Why are you so full of hea-viness,[^]O my soul? /**
and why are you so disquieted with-in me?

Cantor Put your[^]trust in God; /
All **for I will yet give thanks to him,**
who is the help of my countenance, and my God.

Please stand, as able.

Celebrant Almighty and everlasting God, in the paschal mystery you established the new covenant of reconciliation. Grant that all who are born again in baptism may show forth in their lives what they profess by their faith. Grant this in the name of Jesus Christ our Lord.

All **Amen.**

Please be seated.

Fifth Reading: Ezekiel 37.1-14

Reader The word of the Lord. ***All* Thanks be to God.**

During the singing of the following psalm, the altar candles are lit from the Paschal candle.

Psalm 143

Cantor LORD, HEAR my prayer, and in your faithfulness
heed my sup-pli-ca-tions; /

All **answer me in your right[^]eous-nëss.**
Enter not into judgement with your ser-vant, /
for in your sight shall no one liv-ing[^]be jus[^]ti-fied.

Cantor For my enemy has sought my *life*; he has crushed me[^]to the ground; /
he has made me live in dark places like those who are[^]long dëad.

All **My spirit faints with-in me; / my heart within me is de[^]so-läte.**

Cantor I remember the time *past*; I muse up-on all your deeds; /
I consider the works of your händs.

All **I spread out my[^]hands to you; /**
my soul gasps to you like a thirs[^]ty länd.

Cantor O Lord, make haste to answer me; my spi-rit fails me; /
do not hide your face from me or I shall be like
those who go down to[^]the Pit.

All **Let me hear of your loving-kindness in the morning,**
for I put my[^]trust in you; /
show me the road that I must walk, for I lift up my[^]soul to yöu.

Cantor Deliver me from my en-emies, O Lord, /
for I flee to you for re-füge.

All Teach me to do what pleases you, for you are my God; /
let your good Spirit lead me on lev^el gröund.

Cantor Revive me, O Lord, for your name's sake; /
for your righteousness' sake, bring me out of trou-ble.

All Of your goodness, destroy my enemies
and bring all my^efoes to naught, /
for truly I am your ser-vänt.

Please stand, as able.

Celebrant Living God, by the Passover of your Son you have brought us out of
sin into righteousness, and out of death into life. Grant to those who are
sealed by your Holy Spirit the will and power to proclaim you to all the
world; through Jesus Christ our Lord.

All Amen.

*After the final reading from the Old Testament with its psalm and prayer, the
celebrant intones "Glory to God in the highest". Lights are lit and bells are rung. All
then continue with the Gloria.*



serve God faithfully in his holy catholic Church.

Priest Do you reaffirm your renunciation of evil and renew your commitment
to Jesus Christ?

Priest Do you believe in God the Father?

All I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

Priest Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?

**All I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord. He was conceived
by the power of the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary. He
suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried.
He descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again. He
ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father.
He will come again to judge the living and the dead.**

Priest Will you seek and serve Christ in all persons, loving your neighbour as
yourself?

All I will, with God's help.

Priest Will you strive for justice and peace among all people,
and respect the dignity of every human being?

All I will, with God's help.

Priest Will you strive to safeguard the integrity of God's creation,
and respect, sustain and renew the life of the Earth?

All I will, with God's help.

Presenters I present Johanna Pak to be received into this Communion.
Priest Do you reaffirm your renunciation of evil?
Candidate I do.
Priest Do you renew your commitment to Jesus Christ?
Candidate I do.
Priest Do you put your whole trust in his grace and love?
Candidate I do, and with God's grace I will follow him as my Saviour and Lord.

Please stand, as able.

Priest Will you who witness these vows do all in your power to support this person in her life in Christ?

All **We will.**

Priest Almighty God, we thank you that by the death and resurrection of your Son Jesus Christ you have overcome sin and brought us to yourself, and that by the sealing of your Holy Spirit you have bound us to your service. Renew in this your servant the covenant you made with her at her baptism. Send her forth in the power of that Spirit to perform the service you set before her; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever.

All **Amen.**

Priest Johanna, we recognize you as a member of the one holy catholic and apostolic Church, and we receive you into the fellowship of this Communion. God, the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, bless, preserve, and keep you.

All **Amen.**

Priest Almighty and everliving God, let your fatherly hand ever be over this your servant; let your Holy Spirit ever be with her; and so lead her in the knowledge and obedience of your word, that she may serve you in this life, and dwell with you in the life to come; through Jesus Christ our Lord.

All **Amen.**

Priest God the creator, the rock of our salvation, has given us new birth by water and the Holy Spirit, and bestowed upon us the forgiveness of sins, through our Lord Jesus Christ. May he keep us faithful to our calling, now and for ever.

All **Amen.**

The priest moves through the church, sprinkling the congregation with the blessed water.

Unite us to your Son in his sacrifice, that we, made acceptable in him, may be sanctified by the Holy Spirit.

In the fullness of time, reconcile all things in Christ, and make them new, and bring us to that city of light where you dwell with all your sons and daughters; through Jesus Christ our Lord, the firstborn of all creation, the head of the Church, and the author of our salvation; by whom, and with whom, and in whom, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honour and glory are yours, almighty Father, now and for ever.
