

ORDER OF SERVICE

SERVICE OF LIGHT

When the congregation is assembled at the appointed place, the celebrant kindles the new fire and addresses the people with the following words.

Celebrant

Dear friends in Christ, on this most holy night, when our Lord Jesus Christ passed from death to life, the Church invites her children throughout the world to come together in vigil and prayer. This is the Passover of the Lord. We remember his death and resurrection by hearing his word and celebrating his mysteries; we are confident that we shall share his victory over death and live with him for ever in God.

Let us pray.

Father, we share in the light of your glory through your Son, the light of the world. Sanctify this new fire, and inflame us with new hope. Purify our minds by this Easter celebration and bring us one day to the feast of eternal light. We ask this through Christ our Lord.

All Amen.

The celebrant marks a cross in the wax and traces the letters alpha and omega, and the numerals of the current year, saying

Christ yesterday and today, the beginning and the end, Alpha and Omega; all time belongs to him, and all the ages; to him be glory and power through every age for ever. **Amen.**

The celebrant marks five grains of incense inserted into the candle in the form of a cross, saying

By his holy and glorious wounds may Christ our Lord guard us and keep us.

Amen.

The celebrant lights the candle from the fire, saying

May the light of Christ, rising in glory, dispel the darkness of our hearts and minds.

PROCESSION

The thurifer goes before the deacon, who carries the Paschal candle, followed by the celebrant, and the congregation.

The procession halts, and, lifting the candle high, the deacon sings this acclamation.

Deacon The light of Christ. All Thanks be to God.

During the procession into the church, the deacon twice lifts the candle high and the same acclamation is sung at a higher pitch. Also during the procession, all light their candles from the Paschal candle and take their places.

EASTER PROCLAMATION

The Paschal candle is placed in its stand.

As the Exultet is sung, all remain standing, as able, holding lighted candles.

Celebrant Rejoice, heavenly powers! Sing, choirs of angels! Exult, all creation around

God's throne! Jesus Christ, our King, is risen! Sound the trumpet of salvation!

Rejoice, O earth, in shining splendour, radiant in the brightness of your King! Christ has conquered! Glory fills you! Darkness vanishes for ever! Rejoice, O Mother Church! Exult in glory! The risen Saviour shines upon you!

Let this place resound with joy, echoing the mighty song of all God's people!

Celebrant The Lord be with you.

Cantor And also with you.

Celebrant Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

Cantor It is right to give our thanks and praise.

Celebrant It is truly right that with full hearts and minds and voices we should praise the unseen God, the all-powerful Father, and his only Son, our Lord Jesus

Christ. For Christ has ransomed us with his blood, and paid for us the price

of Adam's sin to our eternal Father!

This is our Passover feast, when Christ, the true Lamb, is slain, whose blood consecrates the homes of all believers.

This is the night when first you saved our forebears: you freed the people of Israel from their slavery and led them dry-shod through the sea.

This is the night when Christians everywhere, washed clean of sin and freed from all defilement, are restored to grace and grow together in holiness.

This is the night when Jesus Christ broke the chains of death and rose triumphant from the grave.

Father, how wonderful your care for us! How boundless your merciful love! To ransom a slave you gave away your Son.

The power of this holy night dispels all evil, washes guilt away, restores lost innocence, brings mourners joy.

Night truly blessed when heaven is wedded to earth and we are reconciled with God!

Therefore, heavenly Father, in the joy of this night, receive our evening sacrifice of praise, your Church's solemn offering. Accept these Easter candles. May they always dispel the darkness of this night!

May the Morning Star which never sets find this flame still burning: Christ, that Morning Star, who came back from the dead, and shed his peaceful light on all creation, your Son who lives and reigns for ever and ever.

LITURGY OF THE WORD

Celebrant

Dear friends in Christ, let us now listen attentively to the word of God, recalling how he saved his people throughout history and in the fullness of time, sent his own Son to be our Redeemer.

Help us now to perceive how still more wonderful is the new creation, by which in the fullness of time you redeemed your people through the sacrifice of our Passover, Jesus Christ, who lives and reigns forever and ever.

All Amen.

Second Reading: Exodus 14.10-31, 15.20-21

This reading moves directly into the

Canticle: Exodus 15.1-3, 6, 11, 13, 17-18

Reader The word of the Lord. All Thanks be to God.

While my bones are be-ing bro-ken, / Cantor 2 my enemies mock me to my face; All day long they mock me / Cantor 1 and say to me, "Where now is your God?" Why are you so full of hea-vi^-ness^O my soul? / Cantor 2 and why are you so disquieted with-in me? Put your trust in God; / Cantor 1

for I will yet give thanks to him, who is the help of my counte-<u>nance</u>, and my God.

Please stand, as able.

Celebrant Almighty and everlasting God, in the paschal mystery you established the new covenant of reconciliation. Grant that all who are born again in baptism may show forth in their lives what they profess by their faith. Grant this in the name of Jesus Christ our Lord.

All Amen.

Please be seated.

Fifth Reading: Ezekiel 37.1-14

Reader The word of the Lord. All Thanks be to God.

During the singing of the following psalm, the altar candles are lit from the Paschal candle.

Cantor 1 LORD, HEAR my prayer, and in your faithfulness heed my sup-pli-ca-tions; / answer me in your right eous-ness.

Cantor 2 Enter not into judgement with your ser-vant, / for in your sight shall no one liv-ing be jus ti-fied.

Cantor 1 For my enemy has sought my *lǐfe*; he has <u>crushed</u> me to the ground; / he has made me live in dark places like those who are long dead.

Cantor 2 My spirit <u>faints</u> with-in me; / my heart within me is de so-läte.

Cantor I I remember the time păst; I muse up-<u>on</u> all your deeds; / I consider the works of your händs.

Cantor 2 I spread <u>out</u> my hands to you; / my soul gasps to you like a thirs ty länd.

Cantor 1 O Lord, make haste to answer mě; my spi-rit fails me; / do not hide your face from me or I shall be like those who go down to the Pït.

Cantor 2 Let me hear of your loving-kindness in the morning, for I <u>put</u> my trust in you; / show me the road that I must walk, for I lift up my soul to you.

Cantor 1 Deliver me from my <u>en</u>-e mies, O Lord, / for I flee to you for re-füge.

Cantor 2 Teach me to do what pleases you, for <u>you</u> are my God; / let your good Spirit lead <u>me</u> on lev el gröund.

Cantor 1 Revive me, O Lord, <u>for</u> your name's sake; / for your righteousness' sake, bring me <u>out</u> of trou-blë.

Cantor 2 Of your goodness, destroy my enemies and bring <u>all</u> my foes to naught, / for truly I <u>am</u> your ser-vänt.

Please stand, as able.

Celebrant Living God, by the Passover of your Son you have brought us out of sin into righteousness, and out of death into life. Grant to those who are sealed by your Holy Spirit the will and power to proclaim you to all the world; through Jesus Christ our Lord.

All Amen.

After the final Old Testament reading with its psalm and prayer, the celebrant intones "Glory to God in the highest". Lights are lit and bells are rung. The cantor continues with the Gloria.

Gloria (sung by the cantor)

Celebrant Glory to God in the highest,

All and peace to his people on earth.

Lord God, heavenly king, almighty God and Father,

we worship you, we give you thanks, we praise you for your glory. Lord Jesus Christ, only Son of the Father, Lord God, Lamb of God,

you take away the sin of the world: have mercy on us;

you are seated at the right hand of the Father: receive our prayer.

For you alone are the Holy One, you alone are the Lord,

you alone are the Most High, Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit,

in the glory of God the Father. Amen.

Collect

Celebrant Let us pray.

Eternal Giver of life and light,

this holy night shines with the radiance of the risen Christ. Renew your Church with the Spirit given to us in baptism,

that we may worship you in sincerity and truth, and shine as a light in the world;

through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever.

Christ in baptism, so that we may rise with him to a new life. Now that our Lenten observance is ended, let us renew the promises we made in baptism, when we rejected Satan and all his works, and promised to serve God

faithfully in his holy catholic Church.

Celebrant Do you reaffirm your renunciation of evil and renew your commitment

to Jesus Christ?

All I do.

Celebrant Do you believe in God the Father?

All I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

Celebrant Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?

All I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord. He was conceived by

the power of the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary. He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. He

descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again. He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come

again to judge the living and the dead.

Celebrant Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?

All I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life

everlasting.

Celebrant Will you continue in the apostles' teaching and fellowship, in the breaking

of the bread, and in the prayers?

All I will, with God's help.

Celebrant Will you persevere in resisting evil and, whenever you fall into sin, repent

and return to the Lord?

All I will, with God's help.

Celebrant Will you proclaim by word and example the good news of God in Christ?

All I will, with God's help.

Celebrant Will you seek and serve Christ in all persons, loving your neighbour as yourself?

All I will, with God's help.

Celebrant Will you strive for justice and peace among all people,

and respect the dignity of every human being?

All I will, with God's help.

Celebrant Will you strive to safeguard the integrity of God's creation,

and respect, sustain and renew the life of the Earth?

All I will, with God's help.

Celebrant \God the creator, the rock of our salvation, has given us new birth by water

and the Holy Spirit, and bestowed upon us the forgiveness of sins, through our

 $Lord\ Jesus\ Christ.\ May\ he\ keep\ us\ faithful\ to\ our\ calling,\ now\ and\ forever.$

All Amen.

The celebrant moves through the church, sprinkling the congregation with the blessed water.

In the fullness of time, reconcile all things in Christ, and make them new, and bring us to that city of light where you dwell with all your children; through Jesus Christ our Lord, the firstborn of all creation, the head of the Church, and the author of our salvation; by whom, and with whom, and in whom, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honour and glory are yours, almighty Father, now and for ever.
