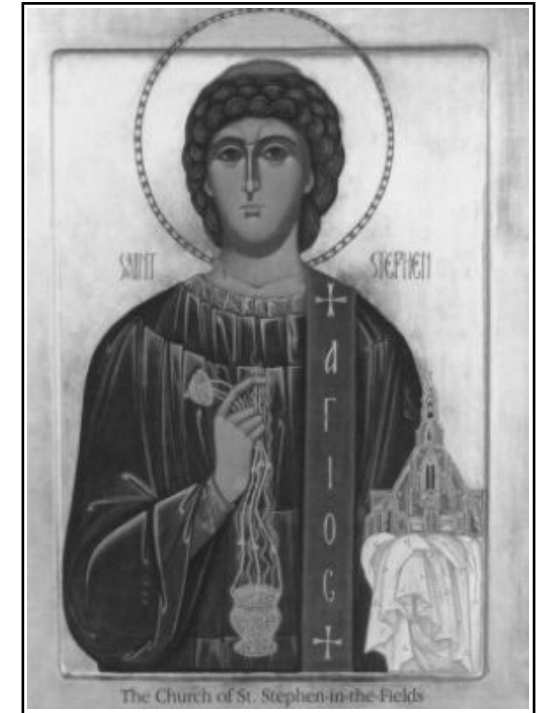

Old Testament Lesson: Genesis 2.15-17, 3.1-7

Psalm 32: *Beati quorum*

1 Happy are they whose transgressions are for-giv-en, /
and whose sin is püt a-way!

2 Happy are they to whom the Lord imputes no guilt, /
and in whose spirit there is no guile!

3 While I held my tongue, my bones withered a-way, /
because of my groan-ing all day long.

4 For your hand was heavy upon me day and night; /
my moisture was dried up as in the heat of sum-mer.

5 Then I acknowledged my sin to you, /
and did not con-céal my guilt.

6 I said, "I will confess my transgressions to the Lord." /
Then you forgave me the guilt of my sin.

7 Therefore all the faithful will make their prayers to you
in time of trou-ble; /
when the great waters overflow, they shall nôt reach them.

8 You are my hiding-place;
you preserve me from trou-ble; /
you surround me with shouts of de-li-ver-ance.

9 "I will instruct you and teach you
in the way that you should go; /
I will guide you with my eye.

10 Do not be like horse or mule,
which have no under-stand-ing; /
who must be fitted with bit and bridle,
or else they will not stäy near you."

11 Great are the tribulations of the wick-ed; / but
mercy embraces those who trüst in the Lord.

12 Be glad, you righteous, and rejoice in the Lord; /
shout for joy, all who äre true of heart.
