First Lesson: Job 23.1-9, 16-17

Psalm 22.1-15: *Deus, Deus me*



- 1 MY GOD, my God, why have you for-sa-ken^{me}? /
and are so far from my cry
and from the words of my dis[^]-tress?
- 2 O my God, I cry in the daytime, but you do not an-swer; /
by night as well, but I find no[^]rest.
- 3 Yet you are the Ho-ly[^]One, /
enthroned upon the prais-es of Is-ra[^]-el.
- 4 Our forefathers put their trust in you; /
they trusted, and you de-liv-er^{ed} them.
- 5 They cried out to you and were de-li-vered; /
they trusted in you and were not put to[^]shame.
- 6 But as for me, I am a worm and no man, /
scorned by all and despised by the peo-ple.
- 7 All who see me laugh me to scorn; /
they curl their lips and wag their heads, say-ing,
- 8 “He trusted in the Lörd; let him de-liv-er[^]him; /
let him rescue him, if he de-lights in[^]him.”
- 9 Yet you are he who took me out of the womb, /
and kept me safe up-on my mo-ther’s[^]breast.
- 10 I have been entrusted to you ever since I was born; /
you were my God when I was still in my mo-ther’s[^]womb.
- 11 Be not far from me, for trouble is near, /
and there is none to[^]help.

- 12 Many young bulls en-cir-cle[^]me; /
strong bulls of Ba-shan sur-round me.
- 13 They open wide their jaws at me, /
like a ravening and a roar-ing li-on.
- 14 I am poured out like wa-tër; all my bones are out of joint; /
my heart within my breast is melt-ing[^]wax.
- 15 My mouth is dried out like a pot-shërd; my tongue sticks
to the roof of my mouth; /
and you have laid me in the dust of the[^]grave.
